- Do not enter backup courses. Your counselor will ask for these at your counselor meeting in February.
- If you have a course locked in your StudentVue that you do not want (excluding level changes) contact your counselor.

Regular or Honors? Placement Questions?

Your teacher will make their best recommendation based on many factors. If you disagree with a recommendation, a parent or guardian must take the step below **by February 18th**.

Level Up request (example: regular to honors)- A parent/guardian must contact the appropriate High School Department Chair **by February 18th**. Counselors will not be able to make a change without Department Chair approval.

Level Down request (example: honors to regular)- Select the lower level class through StudentVue and inform your counselor that you wish to level down. Counselor will make the appropriate change.

Step 4: Finalize with your counselor (January 31st - February 18th)

- Meet with your counselor during PE to finalize your course selections.
- Please have your course request entered into StudentVue **prior** to your meeting with your counselor.
- Give careful consideration to your selections since some of these options may not be available to you if you do not request them during the course selection period.

Step 5: Verify (May 16th – May 27th)

- Contact your counselor for elective changes **by May 27th!** Level change requests **MUST** go through the Dept. chair.
- Staffing and sectioning decisions were based on your original course selections so changes are **NOT GUARANTEED** and will be processed on **A SPACE AVAILABLE BASIS OVER THE SUMMER**.
- Schedules will be viewable through StudentVue in mid-August.

Note: Late Arrival & Early Dismissal

- Seniors must verify with their school counselor that they are on track to meet high school graduation and college entrance requirements before selecting an early dismissal or late arrival.
- Seniors are encouraged to maximize their course exploration at Waubonsie Valley before selecting late arrival or early dismissal. High school courses provide valuable experiences leading to future opportunities.
- Seniors must maintain full time status (3.0 credits per semester) to be eligible for graduation. A student who enrolls in late arrival or early dismissal will not be permitted to drop an additional course during the school year.
- Completed application required. Students will be scheduled for study hall until application received and approved.
