## Step 1: Core Course Initial Placement (English, Math, Science, Social Studies)

- This year your Initial Placement (formerly teacher recommendations) in your core academic courses will be based on recent standardized test scores. Students will have the opportunity to make changes to their initial placement but are encouraged to consult with their teachers and school counselor before finalizing their selections.
- Initial Placements will be viewable in StudentVue starting January 8<sup>th</sup>.

- > Do not enter backup courses. Your counselor will ask for these at your counselor meeting in January & February.
- > If you have a course in your StudentVue that you have questions about, contact your school counselor.

### College Prep, Honors or AP? Initial Placement Questions?

- Initial Placements are not locked. Students & families have the opportunity to update a course selection from their Initial Placement within StudentVue & ParentVue.
- If requesting a level change from your Initial Placement, students are strongly encouraged to review course selection resources on the WV Guidance Website and speak with their school counselor, current teachers or Waubonsie Valley department chair before finalizing selections. Students & families should consider both a student's academic capabilities and workload capacity when selecting courses.

## Step 4: Finalize with your school counselor (January 22<sup>nd</sup> - February 23<sup>rd</sup>)

- Meet with your school counselor during your assigned Math period to finalize your course selections.
- > Please have your course request entered into StudentVue **prior** to your meeting with your counselor.
- Give careful consideration to your selections since some of these options may not be available to you if you do not request them during the course selection period.

## Step 5: Verify (May 13th – May 24th)

- Contact your counselor for elective changes *by May 24th!* Level change requests MUST go through the Dept. chair.
- Staffing and sectioning decisions were based on your original course selections so changes are NOT
  CHARANTEED and will be proceeded on A SPACE AVAILABLE BASIS OVER THE SUMMER
- **GUARANTEED** and will be processed on **A SPACE AVAILABLE BASIS OVER THE SUMMER**.
- Schedules will be viewable through StudentVue in mid-August.

## Note: Late Arrival & Early Dismissal

- Seniors must verify with their school counselor that they are on track to meet high school graduation and college entrance requirements before selecting an early dismissal or late arrival.
- Seniors are encouraged to maximize their course exploration at Waubonsie Valley before selecting late arrival or early dismissal. High school courses provide valuable experiences leading to future opportunities.
- Seniors must maintain full time status (3.0 credits per semester) to be eligible for graduation. A student who enrolls in late arrival or early dismissal will not be permitted to drop an additional course during the school year.
- > Completed application required. Students will be scheduled for study hall until application received and approved.
